



With a vision to be the leading education and training provider in the Maritime Industry, Anglo

Eastern inaugurated their first pre-sea training academy in Karjat, Maharashtra on 2nd February 2010. Located at the foot hills of Sahyadri Mountains with a huge

water reservoir on the North east corner, it seems like the perfect location for a pre-sea academy for training deck cadets and trainee marine engineers. Courses include

a one year Diploma in Nautical Science course – affiliated to the Indian Maritime University and the Graduate Mechanical Engineering course – a one year



bridging course to convert the Mechanical Engineers into Marine Engineers.

Set over a 53 acre site the academy is set up with a strategic goal of being able to control the quality of teaching, "We aim to built on our existing reputation as a leader in the field of Maritime training to

become one of the top Maritime colleges in the world," said Capt. Pradeep Chawla, Director (Quality Assurance and Training).

The plan for Anglo Eastern to have their cadet institute was first drawn in 2006, a long-time dream come true for Peter Cremers, CEO Anglo Eastern Group, "we now

have full control of the quality of our crews, from graduating High School to getting their Master's ticket."

The first batch of 120 boys joined the academy on 7th August 2009 and courses commenced from 17th August 2009.

At present Anglo employs over

550 Cadets onboard its fleet and this initiative will further ensure its long term supply of quality crews in the years to come.

Anglo Eastern has Post Sea Training centers is Delhi, Mumbai, Manila and Odessa. It provides over 50 practical training courses to over 8000 seafarers annually.
