





















A Mariner and a Soldier - Officer and a Gentleman

Commanding the VALEMAX "Worlds-Largest Ore Carrier" is a dream come true.

Though displacing more than 430,000 Mt, the vessel handles very well. She has very good directional stability and the response of the main engine is quick. Her Main Engine is a MAN B&W 7S80ME-C8, 2 Stroke, Turbo Charged with 29,260 KW @ 78.0 RPM power.

The Vessel's Design, Bridge layout, Machinery layout, Main Engine and auxiliaries performance are very good. The uniqueness of these Valemaxs is the ability to load single pass cargo and improved fatigue strength of the hull.

She is 362 m Long, 65 m broad with a depth of 30.4 m and a Summer Draft of 23 mtrs.

I enjoy every moment of my stay onboard, especially the times when I am manoeuvring the vessel. I am proud to be part of Anglo Eastern's Valemax team.
