The award consisted of a statuette, certificate and citation. Chief Guest Sumit Bose, ex-Finance Secretary to the Government of India, presented the award.

Deboo, after sailing as a Captain on merchant ships. came ashore 20 years ago to set up Anglo-Eastern Maritime Training Centre. Today, with colleges in Mumbai, Delhi and Karjat, Anglo-Eastern is one of the most reputed maritime training institutions in India.

Deboo is on the academic council of the Indian Maritime University, a central university set up by an act of Parliament in 2008. He is also an examiner and moderator for Mumbai University.
