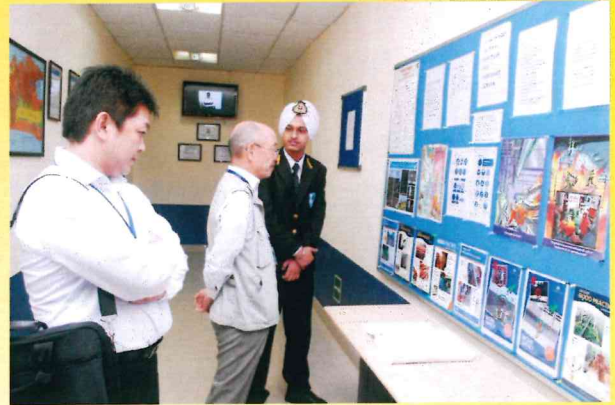


# Key Anglo Eastern officials visit AEMA, Karjat; Go impressed !
